Chaudhary Foundation India Launch

CG Foundation India & MATEE sign MoU

G foundation India and MATEE (Mapping and Action in Traditional and Ecological Ecosystems) announced the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in New Delhi, to jointly identify pockets/clusters of cultural and natural heritage ecosystems fostering sustainable development of regional ecosystems through local creative and cultural industries and ecological practices.

Through the collaboration, CG foundation India and MATEE will aim at strengthening local ecosystems based on community capital such as traditional knowledge and economic systems, creative skills, green and local material, common spaces and sites. A total of INR 30 crores will be infused through the support of various Government agencies & Emp: Institutions towards reaching out to close to 10,000 Indian families of traditional & Emp: tribal communities in the marginal section across the country.

Ankush Seth, Founder at MATEE said, "The premise of this intervention will be

the existing natural and cultural context in the ecosystem. The linked materiality, its uses and possibilities of innovations therein will form the core of the exercise. It will aim to fuel generation of collective wealth and new livelihoods at the bottom of the pyramid by aggregating data, innovation, markets and programming at the door steps of actual keepers

of our tangible and intangible Heritage." MATEE will set up centres that will facilitate vocational learning and resource dissemination, common facility centers, co-working and engagement, doubling as attractive local tourist destination and creative residencies.

Mr. Binod Chaudhary, Chairman, CG Foundation India, on the occasion remarked, that "CG Foundation is happy to associate with MATEE and is proud to be called World's first Corporate Ecosystem that is harnessing South Asia's soft power towards Sustainable Development Goals. The collaboration will help co-create an eco-system of craft & Development Goals. Clusters for poverty alleviation through culturally sensitive methods."

MATEE, which is being incubated by Development Alternatives (DA), is the world's first social enterprise dedicated to sustainable development. It is a research and action organisation striving to deliver socially equitable, environmentally sound and economically scalable development outcomes.

Nepal Social Business Investment

Nepal Social Business, an impact investment program launched by Chaudhary Foundation in partnership with Lions Club International Foundation has decided to invest in two businesses this year, Seedland Nepal Pvt. Ltd. and Moringa Farm Pvt. Ltd.



Seedland Nepal Pvt. Ltd. is a private company that specializes in production of mushroom spawn and fresh mushrooms and is located in Bhaktapur District. The company aims to become the leading mushroom producer in Nepal with a distribution network covering 60 districts. The company hopes to train more than 1000 farmers and generate employment opportunities and help farmers secure a sustainable income.



Moringa Farm Pvt. Ltd. is a commercial agriculture farm in Tistung, Makwanpur District, focused in goat farming including raising and breeding of domestic goats commercially. Besides this, the farm will train goat farmers for establishment of legume and forage grasses based commercial goat farms that will help goat farmers to increase their income. The farm hopes to make goat farming profitable and respectful profession with sustainable production.





In 2021, Chaudhary Foundation is looking forward to the soft opening of Unnati Cultural Village (UCV), the first center of excellence for MSMEs established under the Foundation's Unnati Initiative. UCV, an Art, Design, and Hospitality hub located in Harkapur, Nawalpur District will provide an ultimate experience - celebrating traditional livelihood practices.

The soft opening of UCV will include the launch of hospitality components; Junkiri Villa (Art Boutique Hotel), Kala Ghar (Artist Retreat Center), Tharu Ghar, and Banchha Ghar (Ethnic Restaurant and Boat Buffet). Each of our components represents the forgotten folklore and are inspired by the local Tharu community and surroundings.

The Foundation hopes to cater to sustainable development of traditional livelihood programs and women empowerment through Unnati. Unnati's philosophy is the revival and survival of national heritage through promotion of traditional forms of crafts, dance, music, food, language, and habitat.

Monetary Support to Needy during Lockdown

Besides donating medical equipment to hospitals across the country, Chaudhary Foundation also provided monetary support to two needy families during lockdown period.



One was the visually impaired Budapriti family from Kapan. The family of three consisting of visually impaired husband and wife and their 13-year-old son live in a single room. The couple earned their living by singing in the streets. However, since the lockdown they have been struggling, with no source of income. After hearing about their plight, Chaudhary Foundation stepped up and provided Rs. 1 Lakh to the family as immediate relief. The Foundation also handed their son a laptop so he could attend his online classes.



Another beneficiary included a mother daughter duo, who had been stranded in Kathmandu due to the lockdown. The mother Goma Giri and daughter Jalasa Rokaya had been diagnosed with depression and they had come to consult a Psychiatrist at TU Teaching Hospital in Kathmandu. Hence, Chaudhary Foundation handed over Rs. 25,000 to the family for immediate food supplies.
