## Doing Good Index 2024 Experts Meet

Chaudhary Foundation organized Experts Meet of Doing Good index on 25th June ,2023 at Hotel Vivanta ,Kathmandu. During the meeting, experts representing various sectors shared their valuable insights regarding the existing challenges, limitations, and opportunities faced by social development organizations (SDOs) including regulation, tax and fiscal policy, ecosystem and procurement, and the broader current landscape.

The Doing Good Index is a ground-breaking biennial study carried out in 18 Asian countries by the [@capsasia](#) that aims to highlight the factors that drive or hinder private capital flow towards social and economic challenges. Chaudhary Foundation has been partnering with CAPS since 2019 to run the Doing Good Index study in Nepal.

## Education



### Cycle Distribution

The Chaudhary Foundation provided 20 bicycles to female students of Mahendra Secondary School in Nawalparasi. We firmly believe that this support will alleviate the burden of traveling long distances under uncomfortable conditions to attend school.

## Livelihood & Trainings

### Sewing Training

Mrs. Sarika Devi Chaudhary, the Secretary of Chaudhary Foundation, distributing certificates to the women and girls of Ambas in Nawalparasi Districts upon a completion of a three-month sewing training program. During the event, she encouraged the participants to continue utilizing the skills they had acquired over the three month period.





## Beautician Training

Chaudhary Foundation organized “Advanced Beautician Training” program among the 35 women of Bardaghat Municipality ward no 4 in Parasi district. This training empowers rural women by equipping them with valuable skills and fostering independence. The foundation is dedicated in providing skill-based training programs that cater to the specific needs of the community in Parasi, ultimately contributing to their financial growth and independence.

## Women Health Camp

Chaudhary Foundation conducted a 3 days Women Health Camp different Municipalities of Nawalparasi District. The first event was organized at Mahendra Secondary School at Sarawal-6, where total of 189 women attended for checkup. The second event was organized at Bujhahawa Healthpost Sarawal-7 where a total of 224 women participated in women Health camp. The third and last event was organized at Balmiki Secondary school at Pratappur-9 where total of 270 women participated in this health camp. Altogether there were a total of 683 women directly benefiting from the services provided. These camps aim to address the importance of women's health and providing them with essential healthcare services and support.
